<p>Board of Education – Lisa Galek</p>	<p>CVCC Board: BBH chose an additional representative to serve for one year on the Cuyahoga Valley Career Center Board. Eva O'Mara volunteered to serve in that role.</p> <p>Board Policy: There were updates to 26 board policies. Some highlights include changes to the policy around personal communications devices (student cell phone use), updates to the artificial intelligence policy, and changing the date when a child must turn five to start Kindergarten from Sept 30 to Aug 1.</p> <p>Student Cell Phone Guidelines: Mr. Jakub presented the updated cell phone guidelines for students at the high school, which set specific rules for "green zones" (like hallway or cafeteria) where phones are allowed and "red zones" (like classrooms and bathrooms) where phones are not allowed.</p> <p>Permanent Improvement: There was a presentation on permanent improvement projects, including updates on the Campus Master Plan.</p> <p>Five-Year Forecast: Mr. Yaniglos presented the five-year forecast. You can watch the presentation to learn more about our district's financial outlook in the future.</p> <p>Colony Cupboard: Mrs. Milano and Mrs. Boulton presented on the Colony Cupboard program at the high school, which was recently featured on the local news. They have worked with organizations (including Campus Life and local congregations) in the community to collect and distribute donations for students and families who need help.</p> <p>OSBA Conference: All five members of the Board of Education attended the Ohio School Boards Association Conference in Columbus in November (along with members of our administration).</p>
