The OELPA is a summative assessment of English language proficiency composed of four tests, which together measure a student's English skills in the four language domains: listening, reading, writing and speaking. For speaking, it must be administered one-on-one. With over 70 students in the elementary school, we are close to finishing (testing window is
	 January 30 – March 24) BBHCSD has begun AASCD testing (Alternate Assessment for Students with the Most Significant Cognitive Disabilities). (AASCD) is aligned to Ohio's Extended Learning Standards (OLS-E) and designed to allow students with significant cognitive disabilities to demonstrate their knowledge and skills in an appropriately rigorous assessment. The AASCD will be administered by grade level. Students in grades 3, 4, 6 and 7 will be assessed in English language arts and mathematics. Students in grades 5 and 8 will be assessed in English language arts, mathematics and science. Students taking the HS-AASCD will be assessed in English language arts, mathematics, science and social studies (February 27 – April 21)

	All other state testing will begin after spring break, the second week of April
	Currently planning our half-day of professional learning on March 24
	 Modeling Instruction at the Middle School: Modeling instruction is a guided- inquiry approach to teaching science that organizes instruction around a coherent storyline of model development, primarily achieved through the use of whiteboard and student-created models. This method provides content instruction while students are immersed in the process of doing science. Research has shown students in Modeling Instruction classrooms perform significantly better on measures of conceptual knowledge when compared to similar students in traditional classrooms
