PSO Council President Denise Gawlik called the meeting to order at 9:31am. The pledge of allegiance was said. The meeting was adjourned at 10:35am.

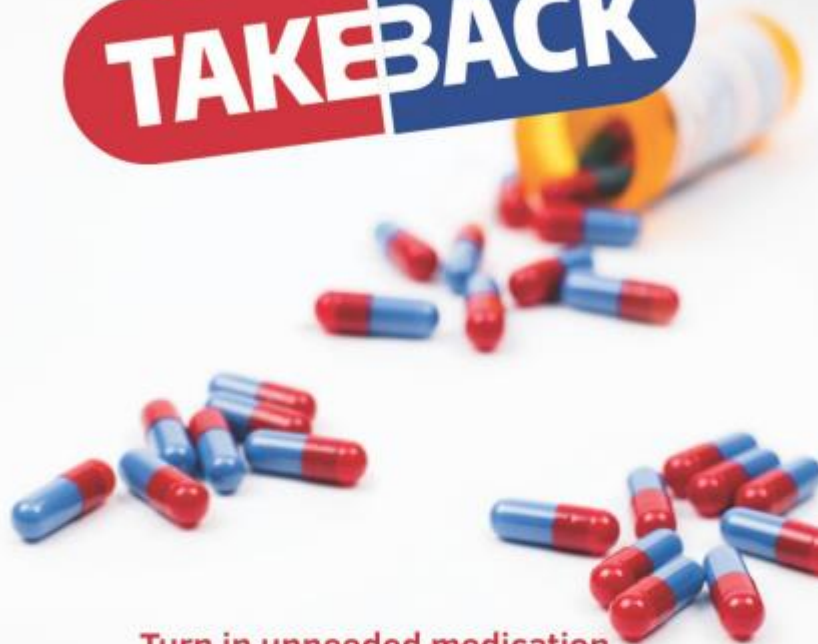

We are looking forward to many future initiatives involving sports equipment and book swaps. The elementary school has a committee who is partnering with PSO.
