High School- Steven Ast - Principal	Concurrent Learning Model Moving Forward In an effort to reduce the need for students to change between learning models when the district responds to the ever-evolving COVID-19 situation in our community, county, and state (5 Day In-Person, Hybrid, and Online Learning), we will be transitioning to a Concurrent Learning Model at BBHHS for the remainder of the school year starting on November 2nd. This will involve all of our students, both In-Person and Online, learning together concurrently. Our teachers working with students through APEX provided an effective solution for learning when we were in a more static environment, however the increased levels of uncertainty and possibility of future change demands a more flexible permanent learning model. Learning Activities for Online Students in Concurrent Learning Model Synchronous Learning (at the same time as classmates) Live Streaming or Zooming (could be for part of or the whole period) with the teacher and classmates Class configuration may include Whole group direct instruction Small group learning activities with classmates Individual breakout rooms Asynchronous Learning (during the assigned period, but learning independently) The teacher will provide an instructional video to watch. An activity will be provided following the instructional video. The teacher will offer an opportunity to connect virtually to get help or ask questions.

Our Membership campaign ended on November 1st. We have 423 memberships, slightly down from last year's 480. Facebook was restricted to paid members only starting on Nov. 1st. We also "hosted" a virtual Scholastic Book Fair in the middle of October. We had approximately \$635 in sales making the PSO \$158, which is well below last year's in-person fair. We also had our annual Middle School Spirit wear sale where we made approximately \$300. Due to the pandemic, we decided not to mark up the spirit wear items as much as usual and offered the spirit wear more as a service to our school than a fundraiser.

- All third grade students completed the fall AIR English Language Arts assessment in late October. Our online students were invited to take the test at the Board Office or at CITE. The scores will return to the district sometime around December. Data from the fall assessment will be used to guide classroom instruction and to provide intervention for those students who demonstrated areas of weaknesses.
- Virtual Parent/teacher conference evenings are being scheduled at every grade
 level at all three schools over the course of several evenings! Teacher will be, and
 have been, contacting families to sign up for conferences over the next several
 weeks. Please remember...that any time families wish to meet with their child's
 teachers they can simply contact the teacher and a mutually convenient meeting
 time will be set up.
- First quarter report cards were available online last Friday. Grade 1 4 teachers provided a narrative on their work in ELA and Math during the first quarter of the year. Kindergarten students did not receive a report card...their first report card reporting will come at the end of the second quarter.
- It is hard to believe that the iReady winter benchmarking is coming up in December for all of our K-4 students. Once the benchmarking is completed we will be reviewing the scores to insure that all students are making growth in both Reading and Math.

As always, thank you all for your continued supports. We couldn't do it all without the support of our parents and PSO groups.


