It's hard to believe only nine days remain in our first academic quarter of 2023-2024 From the curriculum department, we have been quite busy lately! On September 21, we hosted approximately 40 participants at our EL Family Night On September 28, we hosted over 60 participants at our Title I Reading Intervention Family Night O Both of these annual events serve to explain these programs to families as well as provide best practices and practice strategies parents can use to assist with learning at home This week we hosted teachers on Tuesday and



Wednesday at the TLC to collaborate and work on two very important initiatives:

- o Financial literacy at the high school– creating the course of study and curriculum mapping
- o Modeling & inquiry with the middle school science teachers they are working to teach students how to truly think and learn like scientists; namely, rather than having students memorize endless facts, teachers are teaching students to think, inquire, analyze and look for patterns in phenomena that can be applied to other learning situations. Failure is totally embraced, and teachers do not simply say "that's right" or "that's wrong" to student questions
- Last Friday marked the closing of the K-3 reading diagnostic window
 - o State law mandates that all K-3 students be administered an approved reading diagnostic to determine on-track / off-track
 - o These reading diagnostics are used to determine which students will be receiving a RIMP (Reading Improvement and Monitoring Plan) which needs to be developed within 60 days of concluding the reading diagnostic
- Data, data, data
 - o K-3 teachers are busy analyzing the Acadience and i-Ready data
 - o 4-8 teachers can now access their current student data in the CRS (Central Reporting System) to view how their students performed last year; where they are strong and where they are deficient o High school has successfully rostered their student and data
