The district has contracted services with the Center for Marketing and Opinion Research to gather data from multiple stakeholder groups. This work, while in the planning stages for months, began last week with our first staff engagement meeting with the middle and high school staff. On Tuesday of this week, the elementary staff participated. On February 13 there will be an opportunity for parent and community engagement to provide feedback and insights on our strategic plan from 6:00 – 7:30 p.m. in the Middle School Auditorium. For planning purposes, we do ask that all attendees kindly RSVP. There will be additional opportunities to provide feedback beyond the February 13 meeting.</li> <li>Labor negotiations are currently taking place this week.</li> <li>The window for OELPA testing began Wednesday, January 29 and will be open until March 22. OELPA is Ohio's English Language Proficiency Assessment that all English learners must take.</li> <li>Starting today, and for the entire month of February, a number of high school English textbooks under consideration for purchase are available for public review at the TLC (door #25</li> </ul>



	in the back of the Middle School) from 8:00 – 5:30. There are two AP textbooks and two Honors textbooks up for review.  • Last Monday the K-5 math review and adoption committee met to determine the final two math resources under consideration. The process began last year with a review of current materials to this year analyzing all 13 math resources in October that scored "Meets Expectations" on EdReports. We have now narrowing it down to two: enVision by SAVVAS and iReady Classroom by Curriculum Associates. Like all textbooks under consideration for purchase, the public will have an opportunity to review them and complete rubrics.  • On Tuesday this week, the Middle School successfully administered the NAEP to 50 ("lucky") eighth graders. The NAEP is the National Assessment of Educational Progress, sometimes referred to the Nation's Report Card. If selected, public school districts do not have a choice. They must administer it. There is a renewed interest in the NAEP as results are revealing trends in post-pandemic academic recovery.  • A big "shout out" to our Cohort I LETRS participants on completing Volume I of LETRS (Language Essentials for Teachers of Reading & Spelling). 40 participants consisting of all K-1 teachers, reading and special education interventions, as well as administrators, completed the year-long training.  • kindergarten registration begins today  • CCP intent to participate due by 4/1/24


