Board of Education - Lisa Galek	 Present. School Bus Safety: The state released the final report from the Governor's School Bus Safety Working Group. If you're interested in school bus safety and some of the changes the state is recommending, you can read the report here: https://go.boarddocs.com/oh/bbhcsd/Board.nsf/files /D2DPXJ66BF5D/\$file/School%2BBus%2BReport.pdf Campus Master Planning: A contract will soon be approved for the Campus Master Plan project, and the district has selected a company to work with, Architectural Vision Group (AVG). While the plan will contain a long-term vision for the entire Mill Road campus, the short-term focus will be traffic flow and use of the Hilton property. The goal is to have a completed plan by October 2024. Enrollment: Mr. Harrison gave an update on Kindergarten registration. As of February 15, 176 students were enrolled in all-day Kindergarten (which is similar to what it was at that point last year). Safety & Security: The Board approved a five-year contract for the Centegix Crisis Alert system. Each staff member will be issued a badge that allows them to signal for help in an emergency. A \$44K safety and security grant will pay for the first year. Staff: The Board approved an MOU (Memoranda of Understanding) with the BBH Education Association. If nine staff members decide to retire by March 18, they will be eligible for a retirement incentive. Permanent Improvement: Portions of the high school roof will be replaced this summer.

	 Current Enrollment - dry erase board in BOE office with enrollment updated daily, as of 3/5/24 Kindergarten = 217 enrolled for next year (slightly under last year), currently 290 in 1st grade bubble class, 3,730 districtwide enrollment (started 3,706 in August)
	 Centegix Agreement - all district employees will wear badge with a button for crisis alert system, day-to-day use (fights, allergic reactions, etc), alerts SRO/nurse/admins on phones with what and where issue in the building is(i.e. teachers, sports practices, night custodians, etc), entire campus can be locked down with repeated button presses, provides level of security for staff, bus drivers badges will work at each building but not while driving routes, already used in FL, TX, TN and some areas of OH, system invested in to use in lieu of PA system upgrades
