#### PSO Gifts / Donations Guidelines

Rule of thumb: If the item that is being purchased could result in additional costs to the district the item must be approved by the Board of Education members prior to purchase. (technology, building improvements, furniture, painting, flooring, etc)

#### Procedure:

#### Items that need BOE approval prior to purchase

Please present them to the District Director of Business Services. They can give you pre-approval for the purchase and will handle getting it on the BOE agenda for official approval.

Sample of items that need approval:

- Air Conditioning Units\* (window)
- Band Instruments
- Furniture\*\* (desks, tables, chairs, couches) • Fans
- Building/Ground Improvements (courtyards, playgrounds, garden structures)
- Technology (smartboards, iPads, computers, cameras, audio systems, projectors, etc)
- Laminator
- Lighting\*\*
- Pads for gym walls
- Large gym equipment (basketball backboards, volleyball nets,
- Trees, shrubs, bushes .
- Window Treatments .
- Security Items .
- Stability balls / yoga balls

#### For items that do not need pre approval to purchase

They may be submitted on a cumulative list. You do not need to include price of the items.

Sample of items that DO NOT need pre-approval:

- Books purchased from Scholastic or other approved vendor
- Classroom supplies Classroom / school board games
- Calculators
- Computer mice
- Flashlights
- Legos
- Lasar Ray Box & Lense
- Clipboards
- Covers for computers, iPads, netbooks, etc
- Memberships new/renewal

- Balls, jump ropes, cones for playground
